It refers to the quilt top used for the quilt I have been putting together.

The antiques dealer from whom I bought the opt is a blessing because she saw the value of the courage it took the piecer to persevere and finish this top. She saw Perfection in its imperfection. She was its first rescuer.

I, too, have become a blessing for seeing this quilt top and loving its design and The choice of fabrics from men's shirting with its soft and muted colors. (It reminds Me of a sunny beach day.) This unknown quilter passed on her courage to me. She Reached out from the past and challenged me to finish her quilt...to find a quilting Pattern that was flexible enough to enhance her courageous piecing.

This is where I get my inspiration. This is why I quilt. The souls and creative hearts Of those who come before me and those who share their time and talents with me Here and now, I hold in my heart. Then I add my heart and talent to theirs and pass it on to those who come after me.

Wesley Church Online needs Volunteers

Wesley Church Online (WCO) the brainchild of Pastor James Lee designed to deliver a quality Church service during the pandemic will be 4 years old this March 22, 2024. With the pandemic shutting down the world which made it not possible to worship in person; Wesley UMC under the leadership of Pastor James brought Wesley's worship service to the congregation in their Livingroom by streaming the church service over the internet. The goal was to create and record a quality church service for all to view on Sunday Morning or anytime during the week.

Then on September 21, 2021, Wesley UMC transitioned from Livestreaming to an in-person church Service since it was safe for people to gather again. As before, the goal was to create a high-quality Livestream production of the Sunday Worship service for those people not ready to attend in-person worship. In 2021the Livestream team consisted of a production supervisor to monitor the service and make sure the Livestream worked, 2 camera operators when needed and a video switcher operator and projection operator who managed what was displayed on the screens. These volunteers needed to be available every Sunday to ensure a quality Livestream production of the Sunday Live Worship Service.

Since 2021 the Volunteer Team for Wesley Church online has downsized considerably with team members graduating from High School and moving on to college. The WCO Team is looking for new team members who can volunteer one or two Sunday's a month to help with this valuable mission of Livestreaming the church Service on Sunday.

You do not need to know anything about Livestreaming, a church service; we will train you. You just need to be willing to learn when to push a button to change a camera shot or move along a slide or turn on or off a microphone. All the technical stuff is the responsibility of the Production supervisor.

Pastors may change at Wesley UMC but Wesley Church Online is a valuable mission to spread Gods word to those who cannot make it to a church for a Sunday Church Service. We need volunteers to keep this outreach going into the future.
